CHAPTER IV

RESEARCH FINDINGS

This chapter presents the findings of content analysis research which are analyzed by using the theory that has been reviewed in chapter 2. By the step of data collection, the findings are systematically presented.

A. Selected American Teenage Vlogs

The researcher selects 9 videos that match to the criteria. Those videos are:

- 1. 'Answering Your Assumptions about me...' uploaded by Hannah Meloche.
- 2. 'Reading People's Assumptions about Me' uploaded by Avrey Ovard.
- 3. 'Reading People's Assumptions about Me' uploaded by Kelly Margot.
- 4. *'Becoming a SoundCloud Rapper'* uploaded by Jonah Riddle.
- 5. 'I Got a Puppy???' uploaded by Emma Chamberlain.
- 6. *'Thrift with Me (for the millionth time)'* uploaded by Emma Chamberlain.
- 7. 'Danielle Bregoli Breaks down Rob Kardashian & Blac Chyna Meltdown' uploaded by Danielle Bregoli (Bhad Bhabie).
- 8. 'I Have Serious Lying Problem...' uploaded by Alex Guzman (Blesiv).
- 9. 'Testing My Dad's Slang Knowledge (Hilarious)' uploaded by Caroline Manning.

The researcher finds the meaning of slang terms used by Emma from Oxford Learner's Pocket Dictionary and NTC's Dictionary of American Slang and Colloquial Expressions. In addition, Emma often uses new slang terms which are not listed in the dictionary yet. To find the definition of new slang terms which are not listed in the dictionary yet, the researcher uses Online Slang Dictionary and Urban Dictionary on the Internet. Furthermore, some slang terms have more than one definitions. Therefore, the researcher looks at the context to determine the most suitable definition.
