CHAPTER IV

FINDINGS

This chapter presents the findings of the research which are the conversational fragments containing Face Threatening Acts (FTAs) and also politeness strategies that performed by among main characters in *Black Panther* movie. Based on the statement of the research problems, they are including two research problems:

- A. Face Threatening Acts are performed in the conversational fragments among main characters in *Black Panther* movie.
- B. Politeness Strategies of FTA are performed in the conversational fragments among main characters in *Black Panther* movie.

In this research, coding and reducing would be used to give the codes to main characters based on each of their initial names in *Black Panther* movie, types of FTA, and politeness strategies based on Brown Levinson theory. The codes used in this study are:

- a. Conversational Fragments: CF
- b. Main Characters in *Black Panther* movie
 Black Panther : BP
 Okoye : O
 Nakia : N
 Shuri : S

H : Hearer S : Speaker

d. Politeness Strategies types of FTA
Bald on-record : BR
Positive Politeness : PP
Negative Politeness: NP
Off-record : OR

Also, the display of the data was done formerly by giving the description of the setting in the beginning of the movie. The setting of the conversation can help the readers to understand what will provided by the researcher. The finding of FTA are performed in conversational fragments among main character in *Black Panther* movie will be bold since has set in categorization types of FTA by Brown & Levinson theory.

A. Face Threatening Acts Are Performed in The Conversational Fragments Among Main Characters in *Black Panther* Movie

The researcher analyzes conversational fragments containing Face Threatening Acts (FTAs) are performed by among main characters in the *Black Panther* movie. The main characters consist are Chadwick Boseman as T'Challa / Black Panther, Lupita Nyong'o as Nakia, Danai Gurira as Okoye, Martin Freeman as Everett Ross, Letitia Wright as Shuri. Those data are analyzed by using Brown and Levinson Theory of Politeness.

a. Negative Face-Threatening Acts

Negative face is threatened when an individual does not avoid or intend to avoid the obstruction of their interlocutor's freedom of action. It can cause damage to either the speaker or the hearer, and makes one of the interlocutors submit their will to the other. Freedom of choice and action are impeded when negative face is threatened.

a) Affecting Hearer

The following are cases in which the negative face of the hearer (the person being spoken to) is threatened.

• An act that affirms or denies a future act of the hearer creates pressure on the hearer to either perform or not perform the act.

Examples: orders, requests, suggestions, advice,

remindings, threats, or warnings.

b. Positive Face-Threatening Acts

Positive face is threatened when the speaker or hearer does not care about their interactor's feelings, wants, or does not want what the other wants. Positive face threatening acts can also cause Affecting speaker or the hearer. When an individual is forced to be separated from others so that their well-being is treated less importantly, positive face is threatened.

a) Affecting hearer

The following are cases in which the positive face of the hearer (the person being spoken to) is threatened.

• An act that expresses the speaker's negative assessment of the hearer's positive face or an element of his/her positive face.

The speaker can display this disapproval in two ways. The first approach is for the speaker to directly or indirectly indicate that he dislikes some aspect of the hearer's possessions, desires, or personal attributes. The second approach is for the speaker to express disapproval by stating or implying that the hearer is wrong, irrational, or misguided.

Examples: Examples: expressions of disapproval/ criticism/

contempt/ridicule; complaint/ insults/ reprimands/ accusations; contradictions/ disagreements/ challenges.

• The speaker indicates that he is willing to disregard the emotional well-being of the hearer.

Examples: belittling or boasting: no conversational fragment in movie script about this is founded.

• The speaker increases the possibility that a face-threatening act will occur. This situation is created when a topic is brought up by the speaker that is a sensitive societal subject.

Examples: topics that relatstubborne to politics, race, religion: no conversational fragment in movie script about this is founded.

• The speaker indicates that he is indifferent to the positive face wants of the hearer. This is most often expressed in obvious non-cooperative behavior.

Examples: interrupting, non sequiturs: no conversational fragment in movie script about this is founded.

• The speaker misidentifies the hearer in an offensive or embarrassing way. This may occur either accidentally or intentionally. Generally, this refers to the misuse of address terms in relation to status, gender, or age.

Example: Addressing a young woman as "ma'am" instead of "miss.": no conversational fragment in movie script about this is founded.

b) Affecting speaker

The following are cases in which the positive face of the speaker (the person talking) is threatened.

- u. An act that shows that the speaker is in some sense wrong, and unable to control himself: no conversation fragment in movie script about this is founded.
- v. Apologies: In this act, speaker is damaging his own face by admitting that he regrets one of his previous acts: no conversation fragment in movie script about this is founded.

- B. Politeness Strategies of Face Threatening Acts Are Performed in The Conversational Fragments Among Main Characters in *Black Panther* Movie
 - a. Bald On-Record

Bald on-record strategy does not attempt to minimize the threat to the hearer's face, although there are ways that bald on-record politeness can be used in trying to minimize face-threatening acts implicitly, such as giving advice in a non-manipulative way. Often using such a strategy will shock or embarrass the addressee, and so this strategy is most often utilized in situations where the speaker has a close relationship with the listener, such as family or close friends. Brown and Levinson outline various cases, in which one might use the bald on-record strategy, including:

b. Positive Politeness

Positive politeness strategies seek to minimize the threat to the hearer's positive face. These strategies are used to make the hearer feel good about themselves, their interests or possessions, and are most usually used in situations where the audience knows each other fairly well. In addition to hedging and attempts to avoid conflict, some strategies of positive politeness include statements of friendship, solidarity, compliments, and the following examples from Brown and Levinson:

- Attend to H's interests, needs, wants: You look sad. Can I do anything?
- Use solidarity in-group identity markers

Heh, mate, can you lend me a dollar? 'Güey, ¿me haces un paro?'*

Translation: "Do a favor for me?" "<u>Güey</u>" can be an ingroup solidarity marker, usually associated with certain regions of <u>Mexico</u>; literally meaning 'ox', it can be used to belittle someone and/or their intelligence. Therefore, you could only use it with friends without running the risk of a confrontation. To use it ingroup, however, is an indication of friendship/solidarity, depending on intonation.
