A. Background of Study

To analyze the slang, the writer choose the film "Sherlock Holmes: Abominable Bride" as source of research material. The movie "Sherlock Holmes: Abominable Bride" tells the story of 2 detectives, that detective Sherlock Holmes (Benedict Cumberbatch) and Dr. John Watson (Martin Freeman) who investigate the death of Thomas Ricoletti's wife. That is why, the characters of the movie also used slang in their dialogue. Hence the study is directed to analyze slang used in the *Sherlock Holmes: Abominable Bride* movie.

F. Definition of Key Terms

1. Slang

The slang in the present study means an informal words used by male or female teenagers in their daily conversation. There are some meanings of the term slang by experts:

a. Swan (1995), slang is a very informal kind of

vocabulary, used mostly in speech by people who know each other well (p.534)

 b. Spolsky (1998) defines slang as a special kinds of intimate or in group speech and associated with peer group and gang speech to obtain some degree of privacy and to show the solidarity among the members (p.35)

2. Sherlock Holmes

Sherlock Holmes is a fictional private detective created by British writer Sir Arthur Conan Doyle. Referring to himself as the "consultant detective" in the story,

Sherlock Holmes is known for his proficiency in observation, deduction, forensic science, and bordering fanciful logical reasoning, which uses when investigating cases for a variety of clients.

3. Movie

A movie also called a film is a visual communication to entertain people to describe a condition of life. It can make people cry, laugh, tired, excited, scared and more since it has kinds genre like comedy, horror, drama, and many others.
