

CHAPTER V

CONCLUSION AND SUGGESTION

The last chapter in this research is giving conclusion and suggestion. In this chapter, the researcher presents conclusion and suggestion based on the findings and analysis of the research done by the researcher.

A. Conclusion

Based on the research finding and the analysis of the utterances used by the main characters contain of directive acts in the movie script “Around The World in 80 Days” by Frank Coraci in the previous chapter, the conclusion is drawn as follows:

1. Types of directive acts used by the main characters found in the movie script “Around The World in 80 Days” by Frank Coraci

As we know, Yule (1996:54) states that directives are those kinds of speech acts that speakers use to get someone else to do something. In addition, the utterances can be included in directive acts are ordering, requesting, advising, and suggesting.

Based on the analysis of the movie script “Around The World in 80 Days” by Frank Coraci, the researcher found at least 33 utterances contain directive acts by some paradigm cases that used by the main characters (Phileas Fogg and Lord Kelvin). There are four types of paradigm cases of directive acts used by the main characters found in the movie script

“Around The World in 80 Days” by Frank Coraci; (1) Ordering (2) Requesting (3) Advising and (4) Suggesting.

From the analysis that written in previous chapter, the researcher found the totality of directive acts types as presented in the table below:

From the amount of types of directive acts found in the movie “Around The World in 80 Days” by Frank Coraci, the researchers concludes that the most appearance of type directive acts is ordering. Meanwhile, the most rarely appearance of type directive acts are advising and suggesting.

2. The intended meaning of directive acts uttered by the main characters in the movie script “Around The World in 80 Days” by Frank Coraci

Based on the data that have been analyzed in previous chapter, the researcher found the intended meaning of the utterances contains of directive acts occur in the movie “Around The World in 80 Days” by Frank Coraci because the utterances contains of paradigm case: (1) Ordering (2) Requesting (3) Advising (4) Suggesting.

B. Suggestion

After the researcher getting the result of analysis about the directive acts used by the main characters in the movie script “Around The World in 80 Days: by Frank Coraci, the researcher would like to give some suggestions as considerations which are important for the reader, the other researcher and learning process as follows:

1. The readers

The researcher hopes that the reader would not be confused about what people means when they make conversation with them or others because in communication the people implied the intended meaning in their speech.

2. Learners

The researcher suggest to the learners that by studying pragmatics especially illocutionary acts, it may help the learners to reduce misunderstanding of the intention that may appear in the process of teaching and learning process or when the learners have communication with others outclass.

3. The other researchers

The researcher suggest to the other researcher who interested in conducting the research about pragmatics especially in illocutionary acts, this research can be used as the references in conducting the research about illocutionary acts. In addition, the researcher hopes that

the other researcher will conduct the same topic about illocutionary acts to complete this research in different field.
