

CHAPTER VI

CONCLUSION AND SUGGESTION

This chapter presents a conclusion of data analysis that has been discussed in the previous chapter and a useful suggestion for the reader and other researchers.

A. Conclusion

From the result of data analysis on the discussion in the previous chapter by using the theory of Levinson (1983), Yule (1996), and Dylgjeri & Kazazi (2013) which focused on Elsa's utterances in Frozen II movie, and it can be concluded that there are three types person deixis which are used by Elsa in Frozen II movie. The types of person deixis uttered by Elsa as one of main character in Frozen II movie are first person deixis, second person deixis, and third person deixis. The first person deixis is the category of speaker's reference to herself or the group she is involved in. This first person deixis part occurs 77 time. This type of person deixis that is mostly found in Frozen II movie. The categories are I, Me, My, Us, We, Our. Meanwhile, the second person deixis is giving a speaker's reference to someone or who is involved in a conversation. Also, it says as addressee. The second person deixis part occurs 37 time. The categories are You, Your. Then, the third person deixis is a reference that refers to people who are not speakers or listeners of the utterance. This type of third person deixis part occurs 32 time. The categories of third person deixis found in Elsa's utterances are Her, It, They, Them, Their.

Furthermore, this research also analyzes the usages of person deixis. There are two types of the usage which are gestural and symbolic. In this study, the researcher found both of types gestural and symbolic in Frozen II movie. The type of usage of person deixis in Elsa's utterances

are gestural and symbolic, gestural means a pointing accompanied by body movements, while symbolic is a pointing that is not accompanied by body movements and what is pointed can be understood.

In this research, context influences both person deixis and the usages of deixis in interpreting utterances and the meaning. The context help among character in doing communication and also help the audience in understanding the story of Frozen II movie. For example, Elsa said, “Were the Northuldra magical, like me?”. Its meaning can be refer to herself and the usage is symbolic because what is pointed can be understood well.

B. Suggestion

After conducted a research on person deixis in Frozen II movie, which focused on Elsa’s utterances “Main character” of Frozen II movie using Levinson’s theory (1983), Yule (1996), and Dylgjeri & Kazazi (2013), the researcher discoverd three types of person deixis: first person, second person, and third person. In addition, the researcher also found two types of deictic usages, namely gestural and symbolic. As a result, the researcher wants to give suggestions which are important for the reader and other researchers as the following:

1. English Learners

The result of this study used by the english learner as a material in studying Pragmatic, especially person deixis. This research is beneficial to know and comprehend the type of person deixis and the usage of deixis that occur in each statement and the influence of context in interpreting utterances.

2. English Teacher

The teacher can use this movie as a medium in facilitating the student in learning English because this movie contains useful examples for teaching about deixis expression. This movie is also interesting to watch and the language used in dialogue is easier to understand. This movie also teaches to manage our emotion and gives the example to be a good leader.

3. Future Researcher

The future researchers can use this research to become a reference for conducting further research. The other researchers also can make this research as a material for developing their knowledge in deixis and the influence of context in interpreting utterances. The researcher proposed conducting a study on a certain type of deixis by selecting a different object from the researcher. Thus can the type of spatial deixis, temporal deixis, social deixis, or discourse deixis. The researcher also recommends using multiple theories in order to see the differences between them and have a better understanding of deixis.
