CHAPTER VI

CONCLUSION AND SUGGESTION

This chapter presents the conclusion of the most frequent idiomatic expression used in novel by Mark Twain and some suggestion derived from the implication of the conclusion.

A. Conclusion

Based on the result of the analysis before, the researcher pointed out this study to the following conclusions. The idiomatic expression from selected chapter of novel by Mark Twain is important to us know because using idiomatic expression is not to make novel difficult to understand, but to make it clear.

In selected chapter of novel by Mark Twain, the types of idiomatic expression that are most often used in the five chapters are Phrasal verbs idioms and tournures idioms where both idiomatic expression type appear several times in the novel. Therefore, the conclusion of this study is that there are There are 57 phrasal verbs idioms, 12 tournures idioms, 9 irreversible binomial idioms, 10 phrasal compound idioms, 3 incorporating verbs idioms, and 4 pseudo-idioms.

2. The meaning found in the novel through understanding idiomatic expression in the selected chapter of novel by Mark Twain.

Every literary work created by the author has a convey idea and purpose. In written communication, especially in literary woks the authors use the idioms in order to convey their imagination. They use idioms in case to add color and texture to language by creating images that convey meanings beyond those of the individual words that make them up. The

meaning of an idiomatic expression will be known after understanding the context that occurs in the literary work.

From these findings, it can be concluded that this research can be a bridge for readers of literary works, especially the novel by Mark Twain entitled The Adventures of Tom Sawyer which contains many idiomatic expressions.
