

## CHAPTER V

### CONCLUSION AND SUGGESTION

#### A. Conclusion

Based on the finding and the discussion in the previous chapter, the researcher had a conclusion as follows:

1. The errors that made by non – English Education department student are misformation with 87 errors (40%), addition with 61 errors (28%), omission with 59 errors (27%), and misordering with 10 errors (5%).
2. The result show that the total error made on these abstracts is 185. Determiner is the highest and made the total amount by 64 (34%), followed by 40 errors on Noun (22%), 32 in Verbs (17%), 28 in Adjective (15%), 16 in Preposition (9%), 3 in Conjunction (2%), 2 at Adverb (1%), and the lowest error 0 in Pronoun (0%).
3. The errors can be occurred because of interference language, difference concept between Indonesia and English, limited knowledge of English grammar and vocabulary and carelessness.

## **B. Suggestion**

Based on the result of the study, the writer had some suggestions for English lecturers, students and next researcher as follows:

1. For the English Lecturer.

They should provide additional opportunities for students to practice to improve their understanding of the materials and reduce the number of errors in their sentences. When editing and checking thesis abstract papers, the English lecturer should pay greater attention.

2. For the Students

To write a thesis abstract, students should learn to follow the rules of tenses. When writing a text, students should be more careful and pay more attention to the grammar material, and it is recommended that students acquire peer input and proofread their work before publishing their writing.

3. For The Next Researcher

The following researchers could use this study as a model for doing their research in the same field. They should also be capable of addressing the limitations; they could conduct research using taxonomy in this study but in a different area of grammar. The author expects that future researchers will be able to prepare things as well as possible when conducting research and will be able to follow up on this study.
