

CHAPTER V

CONCLUSION AND SUGGESTION

This chapter covers the conclusion and suggestion based on the result of the analysis of speech act of utterances of Elsa as one of main character in the dialogues of frozen movie script by Jennifer lee,

A. Conclusion

In appropriate with the data which have been analyzed and interpreted in the previous chapter, the researcher concludes some result below:

- 1) The utterances of Elsa as one of the main character found which contain illocutionary act are below:

- a. Representative

Representative means representing the thing by utterances that appropriate with what the speaker believes. The researcher found at least 17 utterances of representative act like some example: *But she won't remember I have powers?* (act of assertive)

- b. Directives

Directive means speaker attempt to get the addressee to do something. The researcher found at least 38 utterances of directives act like some example: *Don't let it show.*(act of forbidding), *May I talk to you, please.* *Alone* (act of requesting)

- c. Commisives

Commissives, which are concern with a speaker's commitment to the future action. The researcher found at least 2 utterances of commissive act like presented: *We are never closing them again.* (act of promising), *Thank you...only I don't dance.* (act of refusing)

d. Expressive

Expressive, which deals with expression of psychological state. The researcher found at least 18 utterances like example: *It was an accident. I'm sorry, Anna* (act of apologizing), *Thank you, I never knew what I was capable of.* (act of thanking)

e. Declarative

Declarative, which are related with acts having immediately change. The researcher found at least 1 utterance of declarative act like presented: *Hi, I'm Olaf and I like warm hugs.* (act of christening)

- 2) Perlocutionary act of utterances of Elsa as one of the main characters in the frozen movie script which interpreted by researcher like example below:

The utterance of young Elsa (*hi, I am Olaf and I like warm hugs*), **the perlocutionary act** is the effect on the hearer, then Anna as the hearer called the snowmen "Olaf" as the effect of that utterance.

- 3) The illocutionary act found more than one illocutionary act.

B. Suggestion

After getting the result of the analysis, the researcher gives some important suggestion presented below

1. Suggestion for the reader, the researcher hopes to the reader to enrich their knowledge about pragmatics not only on speech act but also on other division of pragmatics itself. After reading this thesis the reader is expected to investigate and learn more about speech act and could interpreted the utterances in daily life correctly.
