

CHAPTER I INTRODUCTION

In this chapter, it starts with a general explanation and then moves into specifics.

A. Background of Study

The development of knowledge in the world of education is very evident from various perspectives, including the human desire to balance knowledge and skills. The mastery of knowledge can be linked to the subjects that have been studied, for example, someone who is an expert in the field of language and humanities will study subjects related to that field. The researcher is relating this headline in education, for the example the students who want to learn speaking in the way to reach a goal to be a good speaker to achieve an instinctive understanding, the English learner will strive to find ways to become a good speaker; this process of seeking ways by themselves is applied by an autonomous learner. This research is conducted to address reasoning within the autonomous learner and the self-concept as a state of mind by the autonomous English learners. Self-concept is typically defined as the set of thoughts and feelings that the person has about self, involving an individual having full awareness of the importance of learning and reflecting on their own habits in learning. Just like during the lockdown era in 2020, where students were also encouraged to study independently and become autonomous learners. In another study there is a discontinuity between learners' learning awareness to establish their self-concept as autonomous learners and teachers' effectiveness on learning process. For the exact purpose of the last study the intervention is still needed especially in the area of speaking practice, an autonomous learner has a lack of confidence in adolescence, this is when the mental strength of an autonomous learner is tested.³

From those statements, this research relates the topic with the current phenomena of Marina Mogilko as the autonomous English learners. She is a youtuber from Russia who lives currently in the United States of America. Marina started her English by herself towards education abroad and creating

In this study, the researcher aims to re-examine how the self-concept of autonomous English learners can be effectively applied, particularly in speaking skills, and to prove that autonomous English learners can succeed in demonstrating performance in developing speaking skill. In addition, this research is also rarely conducted because no one realizes that it is not easy to analyze someone's learning methods alongside a person's character by linking psychology theories. Moreover, the reason why this research conducts is to prove that autonomous English learners can succeed in demonstrating performance in developing their speaking skill through self- concept. In this research the self-concept is expected to affect the autonomous English

learners to decrease challenges mostly found to the autonomous English learners in improving speaking skill.

F. The Defining Key Terms

Based on the scope and limitation research above, this research states the defining key terms to describe the broad topics of the research, there are Self- concept, Autonomous Learners, Speaking Skill.

1. Self-concept

Self-concept as a state of mind that values a very important role to learn, work, discover interests. Therefore, self-concept, also known as self-study, is defined as an individual's feelings about themselves who act as a whole person and have unique characteristics, so that the individual will be recognized as an individual.⁴ Self-concept also plays an important role as a part of the self that can understand needs within the individual as well as introspection of their own shortcomings and strengths of themselves objectively.

In this study, self-concept influences one subject namely English, which turns out to play a very important role among others, in affecting students' academic performance, student achievements, and for people who desire to learn English.
