

CHAPTER VI

A. Conclusion

Commissive act they are: (1) Act of promising, (2) Act of threatening, (3) Act of offering, (4) Act of warning. Expressive act they are: (1) Act of apologizing, (2) Act of thanking, (3) Act of welcoming, (4) Act of like. Declarative act it is: (1) Act of arresting
